- 60,912 men were released from state prisons/jails in FY2013.
- Over 4300 of those were released on parole to the Dallas area (not including Fort Worth) as well as unknown hundreds of men who served their complete sentence and returned.

Given only a shirt and a pair of pants, \$100, and a bus ticket upon their release, these men return to their communities after years of incarceration faced with many challenges to successful reintegration and limited, if any, support.

The ministry of One Man's Treasure is centered on the belief that if these men come home from prison with a desire to change their lives *and* can find employment, they can lift themselves from poverty and become a productive member of society and a positive role model for those around them.

Since 2005, One Man's Treasure has provided sets of clothing to over 5500 men, including more than 1700 in the past two years. We anticipate that over 1000 men will be served by the ministry in 2015.
